

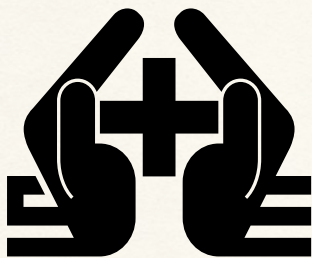

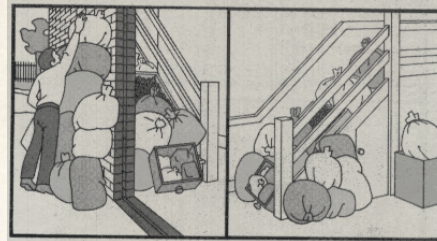
1. BE CONSIDERATE

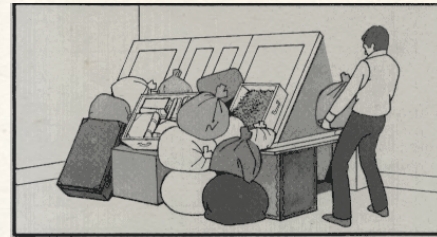
2. SUPPORT YOUR PARTY
